





2:15pm Strahov Library

Visit Duration: 1 hour

Address: Strahovské nádvoří 132/1, 118 00 Prague, Czechia

Notes: Go for just the Library tickets. Well worth seeing!

You cannot pre-book or purchase tickets online for Strahov Monastery. All tickets must be purchased at the information desk on the day of your visit located near the main entry gate.

Although I read online that they only take cash, I'm pleased to say that contactless card payments are now available.

A tour of the Strahov Library without a guide (without entrance to the halls), in which you will see both library halls, the Cabinet of Curiosities, and also an exhibition dedicated to the Strahov Library.

Common circuit (~\$16-17)

26. 8. 2025, 9:00–17:00

A complete tour of the monastery premises without a guide, which includes the Strahov Library (without entry to the library halls), the gallery and other historical areas of the monastery. From 5 May to 12 October 2025, this Joint Tour includes only the library and the gallery. The cloisters are not accessible due to an ongoing exhibition.

Visit Duration: 2 hours, 15 mins

0.4 mi, 8 minutes walking from Strahov Library

Petrin Hill offers stunning sights, gorgeous gardens and some fun attractions like the miniature Eiffel Tower. Petrin Hill is located at the center of Prague and rises about 130m above the Vltava River's left bank. The hill is covered with numerous parks, which is considered as the most favorite recreational area for Prague's inhabitants. It is featured in the early short story of Franz Kafka, which is called Description of a Struggle. It was also mentioned in the novel of Milan Kundera, which is entitled The Unbearable Lightness of Being. Visiting Petrin Hill may require climbing a little bit as it is located at Prague's high point. It may therefore take about thirty minutes to walk just to reach its top but it is guarantee that you will enjoy the views while climbing up.



Once the most important bridge for commerce, the Charles Bridge in Prague is still very important, but now it is primarily significant for tourism. This beautiful cobblestone bridge is lined with intricate statues and lamp posts on either side. It crosses the river Vltava to the Prague Castle, and was named for King Charles IV who commissioned its building. The view from this bridge of both the city skyline and the river below it are stunning. Visitors are welcome and encouraged to walk across the bridge as it is now a pedestrian road. Musicians, street performers, artists and other vendors line the street during the busiest times of the day. The quietest times are early morning and late evening. This is a don't miss spot in Prague.



Beautiful time to see the Charles Bridge - from dawn until 7:00AM when less busy and lighting is great for photos.

7:15am Lennon Wall



Visit Duration: 30 mins

0.1 mi, 3 minutes walking from Charles Bridge

The John Lennon Wall, or Lennon Wall, is located near the Prague French Embassy. The wall is filled with Lennon inspired graffiti, art and Beatles song lyrics. Police have attempted to paint over the wall several times over the years, but the wall is always re-painted with the Lennon-inspired art and words.

The Lennon Wall was created after he was shot in 1980. Before his death Lennon was an inspiration to Czech youth, as he songs of freedom and independence. Both constructs weren't available in Czech, and people were jailed and/or fined for playing Beatles music or Lennon music. After his death in 1980, this wall near the river had a mural of Lennon painted onto it. This and graffiti were repeatedly painted over by authorities, but Czech youths continued to repaint the wall with Lennon images and words.

The Lennon Wall is credited with helping to start the Velvet Revolution. The Velvet Revolution, which was non-violent stand against Communism. The Communist regime in Prague fell in 1989. In 1998 the wall had to be reconstructed, and the only early art still left on the wall is that of a picture of a yellow submarine.

The Lennon Wall is located at Velkoprevorské Namesti, Mala Strana, and can be best viewed close up. You'll need at least an hour to look at the words and pictures on the wall. There are many nearby shops that sell postcards and books with pictures from the wall.

Visit the wall during the daylight, as at night the visual works are difficult to see.



On a hilltop west of the Vltava River, resided what is perceived by many as Prague's number one tourist attraction – the Prague Castle.

What is called "The Prague Castle" is actually a huge complex of buildings connected by internal courtyards and built throughout the last 1000 years. It therefore provides a great opportunity to visit, in a relatively small location many architectural styles of the last millennium.

An exploration of the castle can take anything between half a day and a full day, depending on how well you want to explore it. The main sights within the Castle are St. Vitus Cathedral, St. George's Basilica, the Royal Palace, the Powder Tower, and of course the Golden Lane in which Frantz Kafka used to live for a while.

If you are interested in doing a little climb up the road, you can certainly walk up directly to the castle from Charles Bridge. Alternatively, it is also possible to use metro line A to Malostranská followed by tram no. 22 north (two stops) to "Prazský hrad".



Situated on a rocky promontory above the Vltava River, it offers stunning views of the city, and the park area holds hidden architectural treasures including the rare Romanesque Rotunda of St Martin, the neo-Gothic Church of Sts Peter and Paul, the national cemetery Slavín, and the underground casements housing the some of the original Baroque statues from the Charles Bridge.



Bethlehem Chapel is a renowned chapel, which was having the status of a church in the history. It can hold more than 3,000 people, yet it has lost his status of the church.

Bethlehem Chapel is present in Bethlehem Square, which is located in old town Prague. The origin of this building is medieval and its known as a preaching place of Jan Hus. The foundation of the Chapel was laid by the Wenceslas Kriz, in 1319. Preaching in Czech language was the most important thing about this place. However, once it was broken from the Medieval Bohemian Church, it was called as a Chapel and not a church.

In 1412 Pope ordered to destroy the chapel, but Old town council rejected the idea. However, in 1786 a section of Chapel was destroyed, which was reconstructed later in the 20th century. The place holds some medieval walls even now, which were restored to their original shape. In 1987, Czech technical University took the hold of the Chapel and the place was restored and opened for public. Now many university ceremonies are also organized in Bethlehem chapel.

Other than the main hall, Bethlehem Chapel has a vast lobby, which has many private rooms, bathrooms, and coat rooms. The st. Wenceslas hall is used for social events, while the ceremony hall is used for social and academic events. Many state events and international conferences also held in this hall. It has the capacity to hold 400 people in the auditorium, while stage has 22 chairs.

Now a day, Bethlehem Chapel holds many religious services. Some time classical musical concerts are also organized in the building. If you are planning to visit Bethlehem chapel, make sure that you attend a musical concert here. Classical music in medieval environment will be a memorable experience for you.

It is located the Josefov, the Jewish Quarter, one block away from the famous Old-New Synagogue and holds around 12,000 visible tombstones in a small yard which are only a small part out of the thousands of graves buried below. The reason is the rules published from the 15th century to 1787 by the rulers of Prague that did not allow for Jews to bury their dead anywhere else. The lack of space caused the graves to be piled one on top of the other. There are two significant graves here - the oldest, which belongs to one Avigdor Kara (a poet), who died according to the records in 1439 and the well-known grave of Jehuda ben Bezalel who is known for creating the "Golem of Prague".

One of the most beautiful synagogues in Europe, the Spanish Synagogue is located in the Jewish section of Prague. The synagogue is one of the oldest buildings in Prague, and was recently restored in the 1990s.

The Spanish Synagogue was built in 1868 at the site of the oldest Jewish home in the city of Prague. A Czech architect, Vojtech Ullmann, designed the synagogue with glasswork designed by Baum & Munzberg. The Spanish synagogue fell into ruin after the Nazi and later the communist party took over rule of Prague. It was not reopened until its 130th anniversary, in the 1990s.

The Spanish Synagogue is a square building, with a dome covering most of the space. On three sides of the building there are open galleries, which enter into the main nave. There is also interior décor featuring stucco, Islamic motifs and balustrades. An interesting fact about the Spanish Synagogue is that it was never actually used by the Spanish Jewish population - it is named after the Spanish-influenced exterior design.

The most impressive part of the Spanish synagogue is most probably its interior dome and the accents on the walls and ceilings while the Spanish, Islamic and Czech influences work together to create a beautiful building. The interior is best seen during daylight hours, when the beauty of the moldings, artwork and gilding can be best seen. The organ is piece of art itself, and many tourists flock to the Spanish Synagogue simply to see this one artifact.

Located in Josefov, the Jewish quarter in Prague, is this mid-13th century Gothic style synagogue. In fact, it is one of the earliest and most important Gothic buildings in Prague. The synagogue, which has survived events such as fires and the Nazi occupation, is still active which makes it Europe's oldest active synagogue. Its name (old-new synagogue) is related to the legend that implies that it was built on top of an ancient Jewish pray house.

Note that men are expected to cover their heads while inside, and if you attend the synagogue while its active and wish to watch the event then men and women will need to sit apart.

The place is not part of the Jewish Museum and hence requires purchasing a separate ticket.



At the heart of Prague's Old Town, this majestic and extremely popular by tourists square with its colorful baroque houses is located just between the famous Wenceslas Square and Charles Bridge. The square presents several architectural styles such as gothic of the Týn Church or baroque architecture of the St. Nicholas Church. Many tourists come here to see the medieval Astronomical Clock built on top of the Town's Hall that provides a musical show every hour from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM. The Astronomical Clock, which now proudly symbolizes Prague, was originally build in 1410 which makes it the oldest working astronomical clock in the world. The various signs on the clock stand for the phases of the moon, the seasons and also for some of the Christian holidays.

You may want to climb up to the Old Town Hall's tower to get a magnificent view of Staroměstské náměstí but keep in mind that the climb may be challenging as the steps are quite narrow and steep. If you're not fit for that, taking the elevator may be a good alternative.

As a day visit is a must, you may want to return at night time if only to have a look at the baroque buildings as they are lighted by the towers of the Týn church.
